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## Executive Summary

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This report describes the DANTE Dissemination pack and website (content and structure) designed by project partners and published, with the support of screenshots and images taken from the online site and from the dissemination means.

The website, available since M3 at the URL <http://www.h2020-dante.eu>, is the main communication channel developed and used by the DANTE consortium to:

- ensure adequate presence of the DANTE project on the web;
- inform target groups and general public about aims and objectives of the project;
- disseminate project's activities and initiatives;
- support the creation of synergies with similar projects to attract and concretely involve the relevant actors within the framework of counter terrorism;
- be the main tool to communicate, transfer knowledge and exchange information facilitating the collaboration between the potential users and the further extensions and adoption of the project outcomes.

The dedicated server hosting the DANTE website ensures flexibility to choose the most appropriate tools and technologies to support the website's evolving requirement.

The dissemination pack prepared for the DANTE project includes: the official logo of the project, a brochure with the most relevant information about the project aims and benefits introduced and a poster.

# 1 Introduction

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The official DANTE Dissemination pack and DANTE website timing release was foreseen at M3 since the proposal preparation phase in order to allow the consortium to prepare and have available since the beginning of the project a comprehensive set of tools to be used in the dissemination activities.

More in particular,

- The **project website**, available at the URL <http://www.h2020-dante.eu> since early November 2016 (M3) has been designed in order to present:
  - description of the project aims and the benefits expected from the research and innovation activities carried on during the project lifetime;
  - general information about DANTE partners and their expertise;
  - main relevant public information related to activities carried out during the development of the project;
  - updated news and events about security, analysis of suspicious retrieved data (video, images, texts and audio), ethics and privacy, ontology of terrorisms related suspicious data.
- The **Dissemination pack**, prepared and published at the beginning of M3, includes diverse means designed and published for creating a common and clear graphic layout of the project and for creating a project brand, supporting therefore the dissemination activities carried out by the project consortium. In particular, the dissemination pack includes:
  - a **project logo**, aiming at clearly define a project brand;
  - a **brochure and a poster**, reporting main aims and benefits of the project;
  - an **electronic newsletter** template;

In the following sections, both Dissemination pack and the website published will be reported and detailed.

## 2 Communication means and materials

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Specific tools and communication material have been realized and published with the main aim of providing project partners with adequate means for carrying out dissemination activities.

The dissemination material has been developed for being used according to different communication needs and to various event typologies.

The communication material available since M3 of the project consists in:

- DANTE graphic identity;
- DANTE brochure: to be printed and distributed in events/meetings and to be sent electronically via email for presenting the project;
- DANTE poster: to be shown in conferences or events;
- public project web site;

Communication material will be refined periodically in order to be aligned with the status of development of the project.

### 2.1 DANTE graphic identity and logo

The project dissemination activities started with the setting up of a project graphical identity, with the purpose of maximizing the visibility of the project. In order to provide a coherent and consistent graphic identity to the DANTE project, self-explanatory graphic were designed.

The graphical representation makes use of images that clearly identify the message of the project purpose with the aim of strengthening the project brand and messages delivered by project communications.

## 2.2 Project brochure

## 2.4 Project e-newsletter

The sections from 1 to 9 belong to the **“Public area”** of the website, thus all the content and the functionalities available in these sections are accessible to all visitors. These sections can be reached through the main horizontal menu.

Section 10, **“Private Area”**, links to a dedicated DMS (Document Management System) dedicated to project partners and advisory board members. Such a repository has the aim of providing the project consortium of a common space allowing them to share documents and relevant information of the project. This last section is available through a direct link at the top of any page of the website.

The website header includes highly evocative images of the subject of the project’s main purpose and content.

In the following of the paragraph the contents of each section are described.

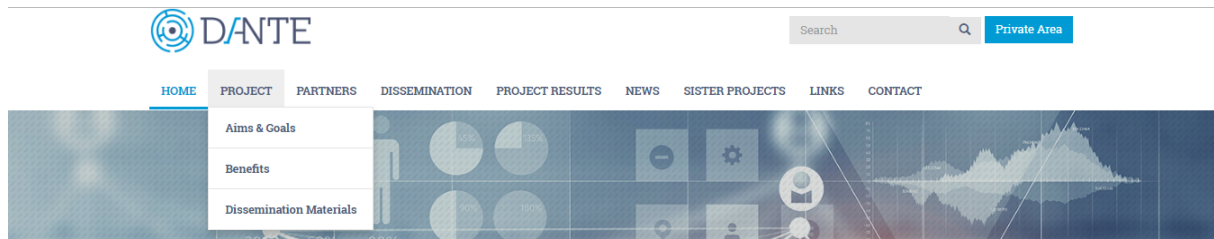


Figure 8: DANTE Menu – expansion of the “Project” menu voice

The next figures show the pages available in this section of DANTE Web Portal.



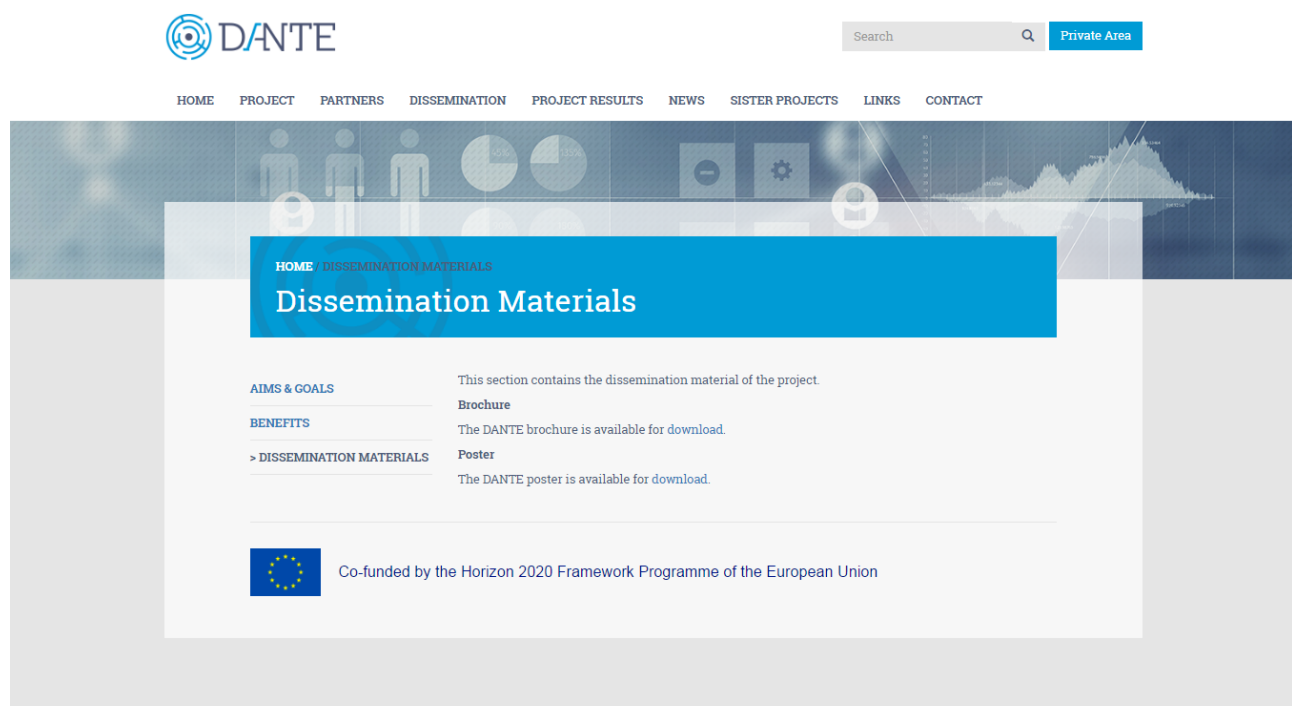
Figure 9: DANTE project’s aims

### 3.2.2 Section “Partners”


In the section “Partners” the information of the partners of the DANTE project is reported. In the first level of the page, logos and names of the organisations partners are reported (Figure 12). Clicking on their logos or on their names, a page with details of the organisation selected is reported (Figure 13), with a side-left menu for exploring details of all partners.

For each organisation the following information is included:

- the name and the country of the organisation;
- the logo of the organisation;
- a link to the website homepage of the partner. Clicking on the link, a new window is opened with the target website;
- a brief description of the organization with the highlight of its main competences related to the project (this information can be visualized expanding the visible text through the “+” on the right side of the page).

### 3.2.3 Section “Dissemination”

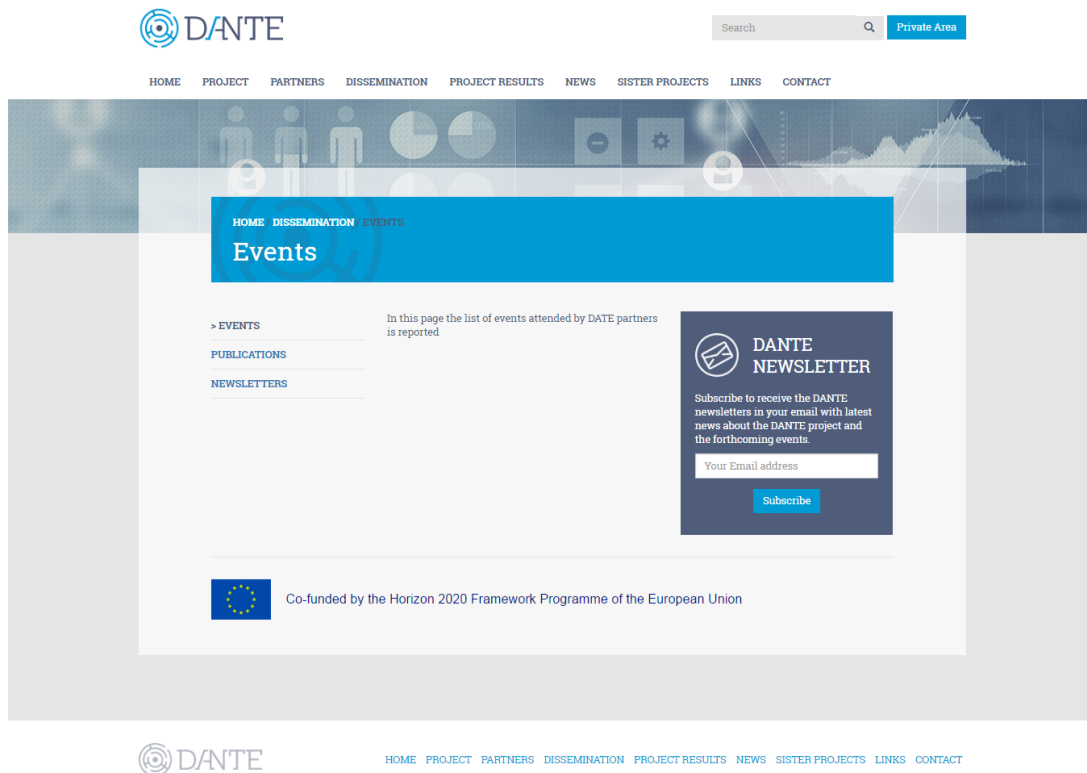

- the **events** (conferences, exhibits, industrial fairs, workshop etc.) attended by project partners for disseminating DANTE results;

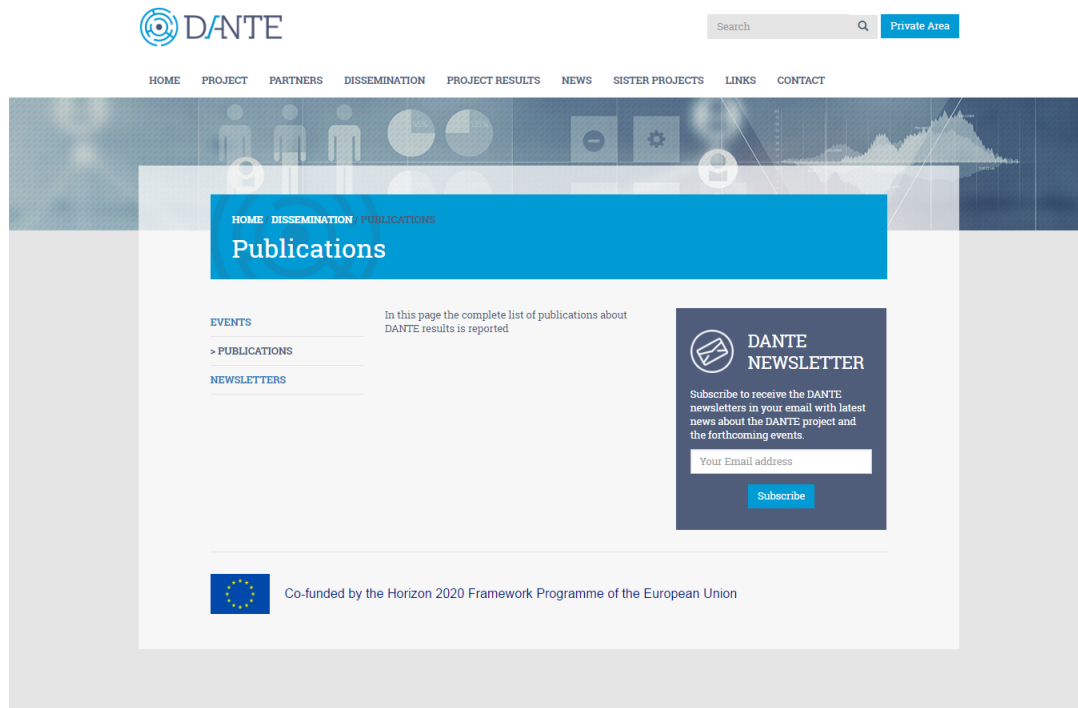
- the **publications** (scientific papers, conference proceedings, journal publications, articles etc.) published by project partners for disseminating DANTE results;

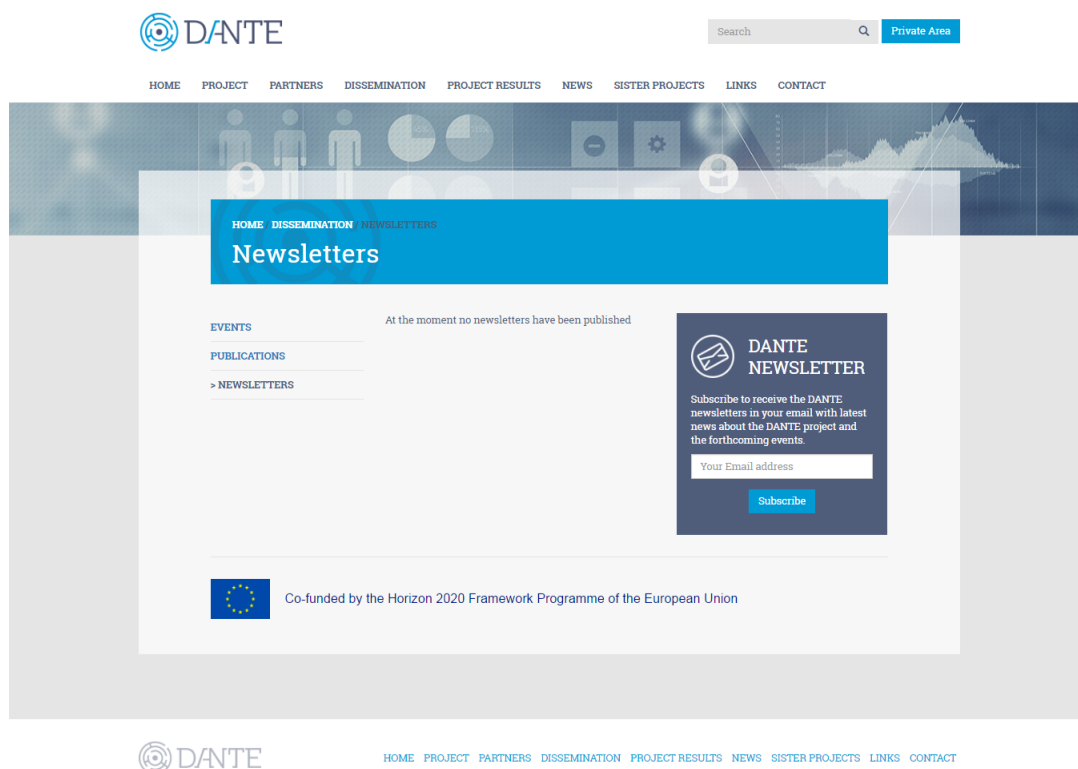


**Figure 14: DANTE events participation**

The “Project Results” section reports information related to the public reports delivery project results of the project.

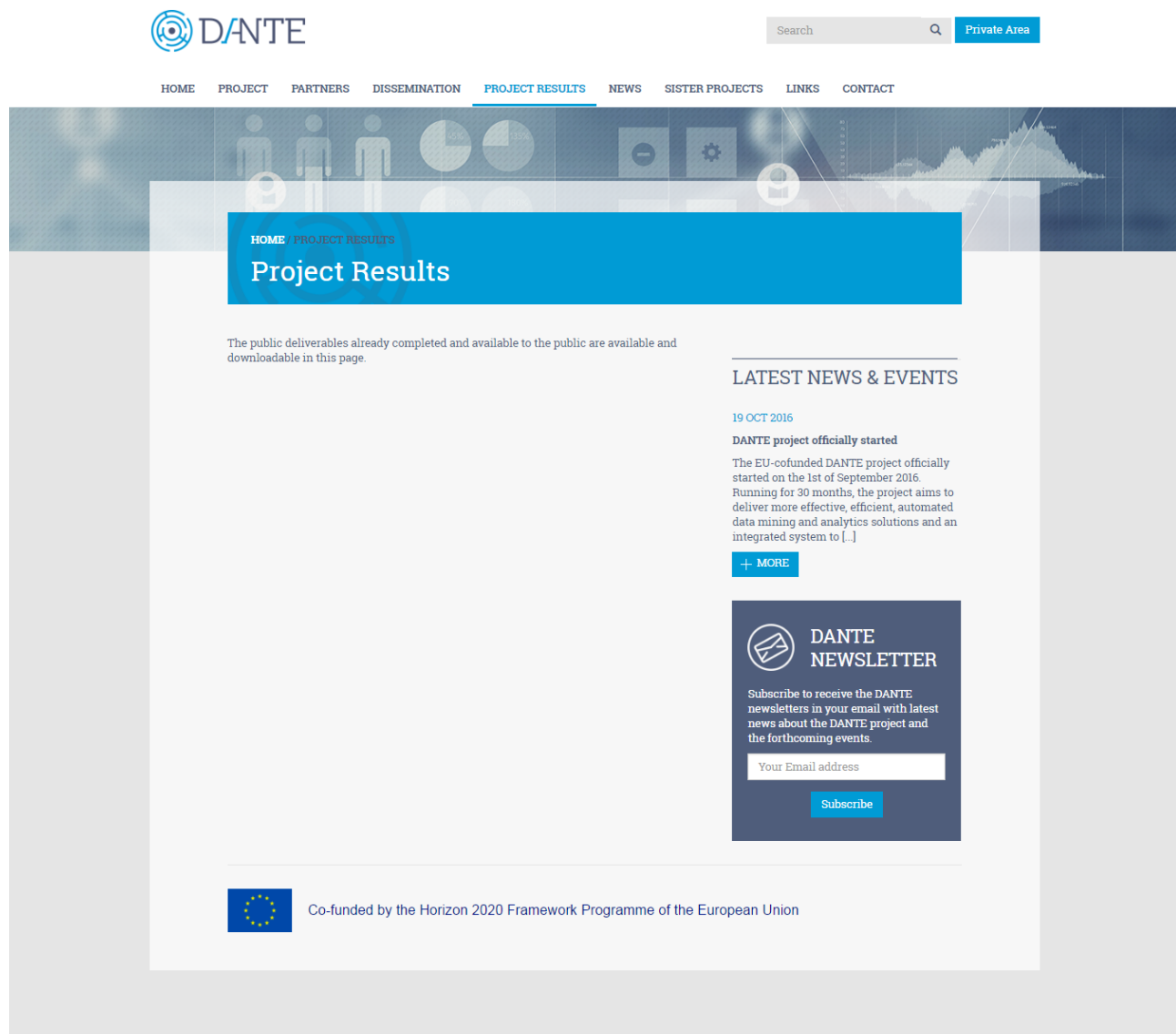


Figure 17: DANTE Project Results section

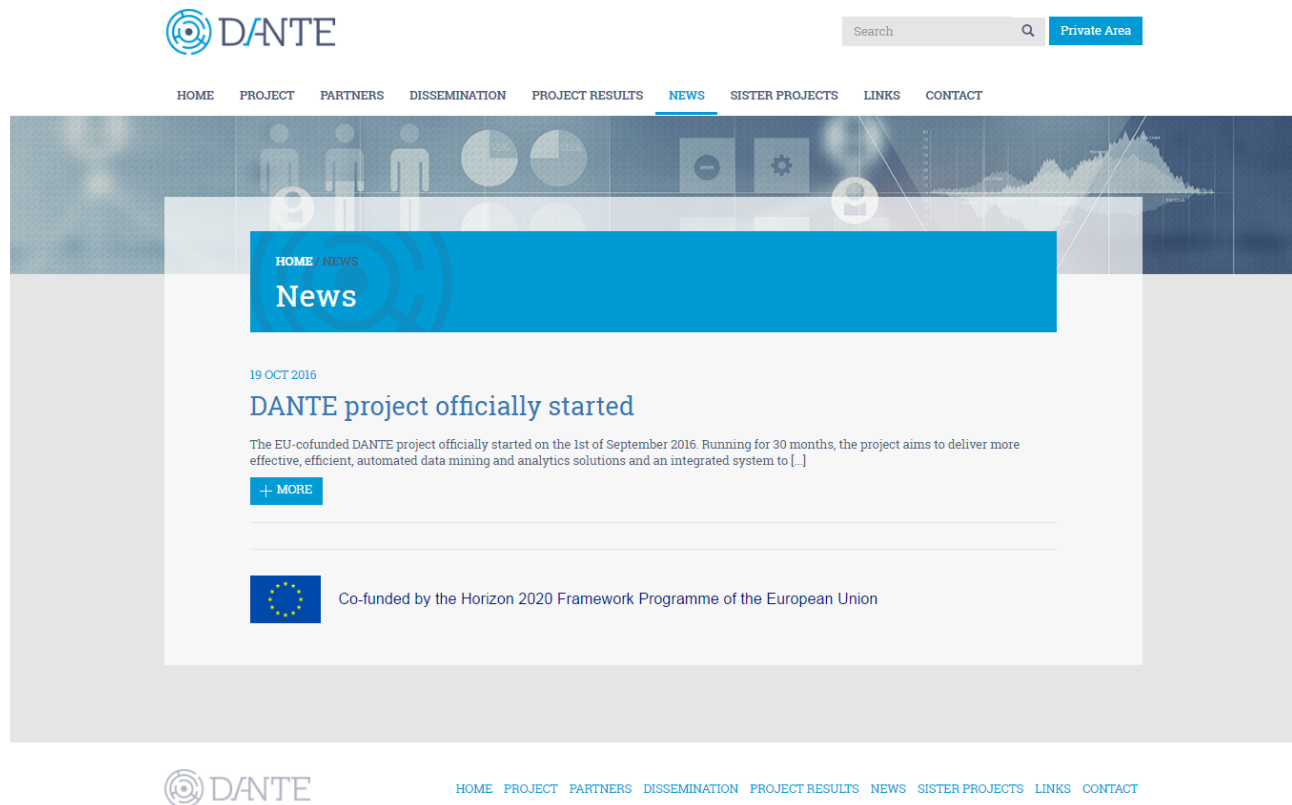
### 3.2.5 Section “News”

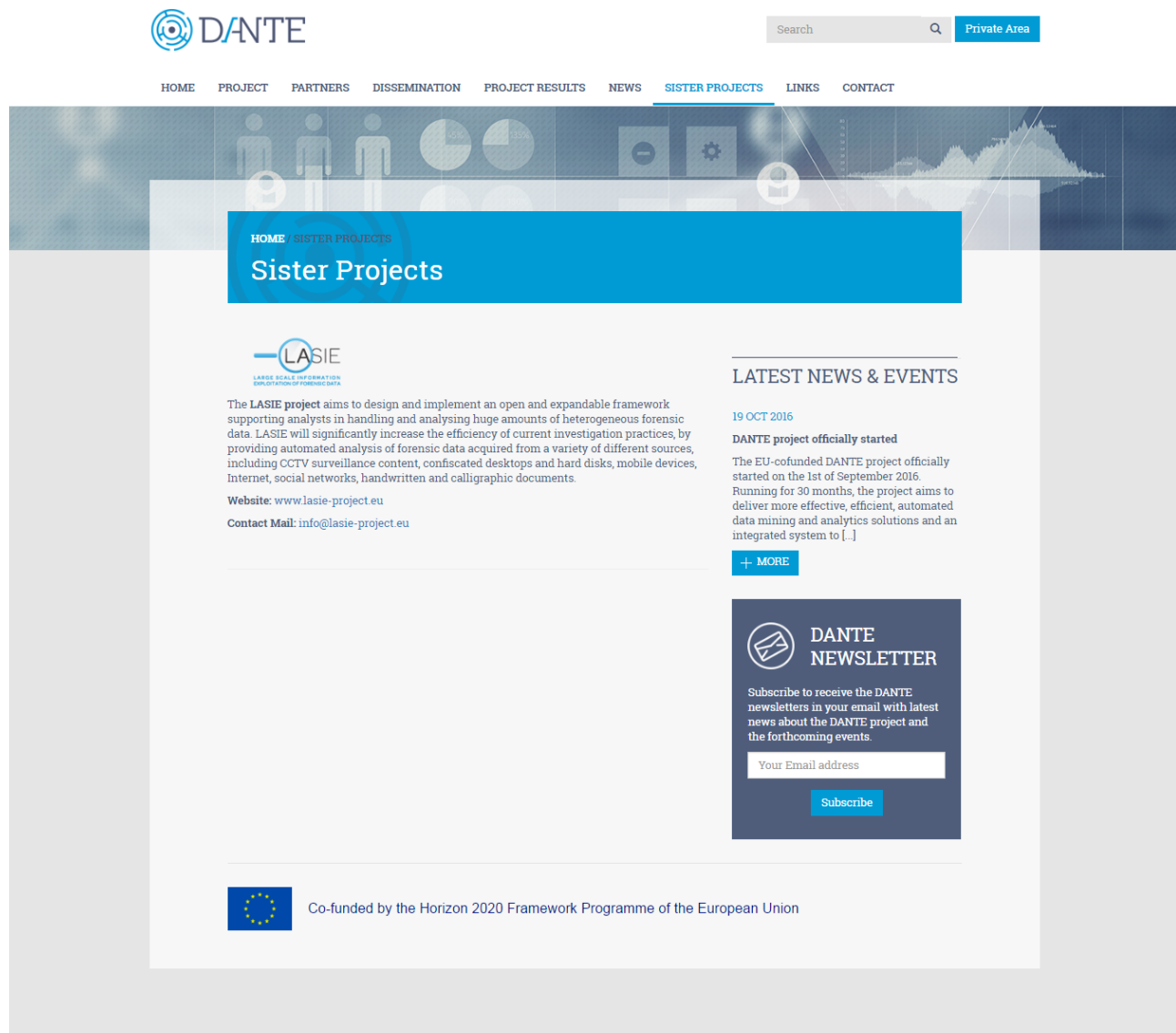


Figure 19: DANTE related projects

The “Links” section reports a brief list of links to relevant bodies of the security field at EU level. The list will be maintained updated and enriched by further links during the project life.

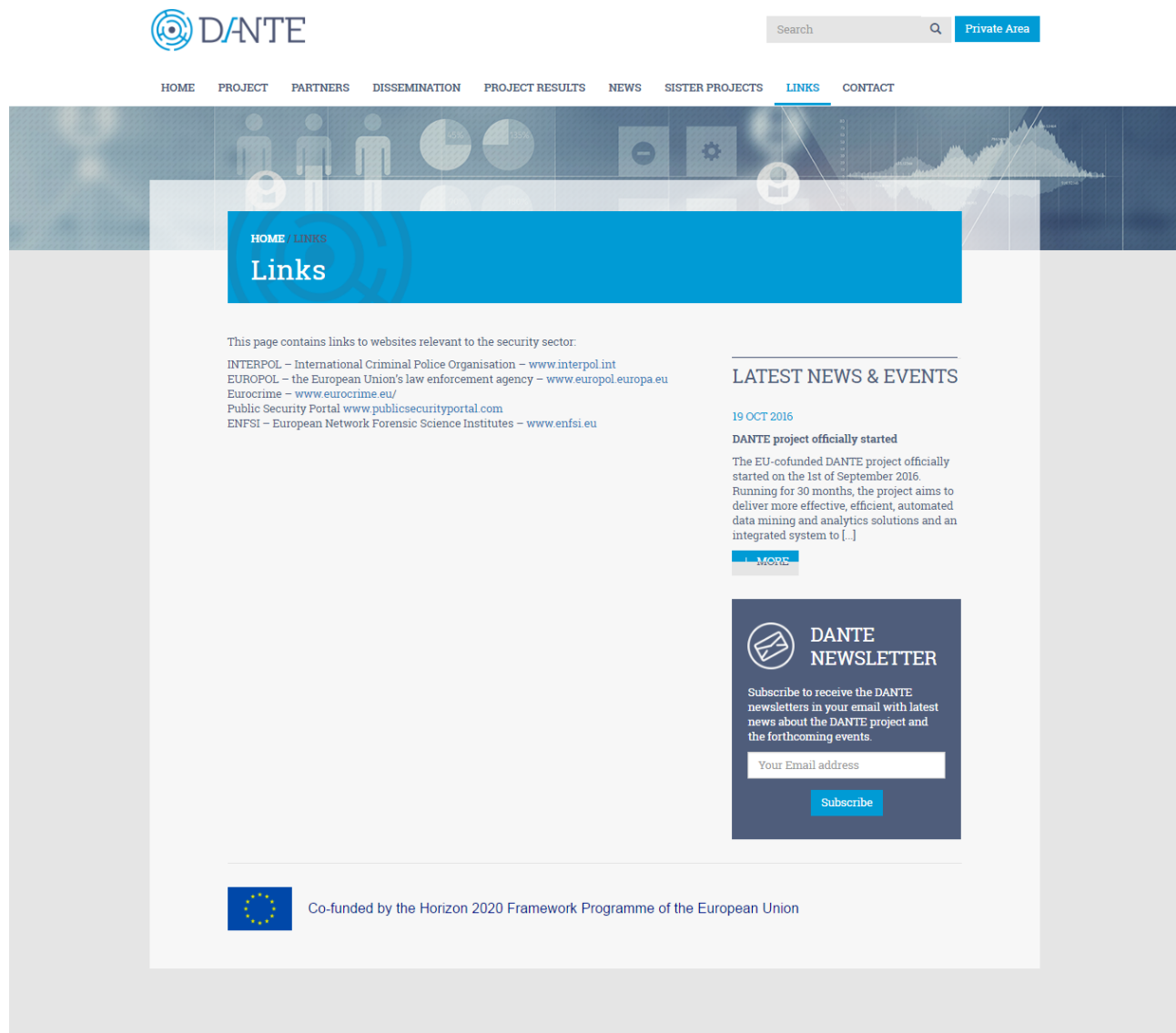



Figure 20: DANTE Links
